THEME FOR THE 2008 MEETING: CITIZENSHIP, COMMUNITY, AND CONFLICT

Nations of the world struggle with issues of immigration and borders, national identity and global responsibility, and ethnicity and inclusion. Seyla Benhabib in *The Rights of Others: Aliens, Residents, and Citizens* (Cambridge 2004), reminds us that here in the United States, young people without citizenship status are able to join the armed services and die for the country in which they have no “legal” rights. She advises more open and democratic policies toward human beings, wherever they seek to build, or rebuild, their lives.

When hurricane Katrina hit the Gulf Coast region of the United States more than four years ago, the nation watched as members of one community, New Orleans’ ninth ward, fought for their individual and collective lives. In the aftermath of Katrina we heard many stories concerning the meaning of community for those who struggled through

this momentous event. That aftermath forced all of us to ask of ourselves the questions being asked in New Orleans: What makes community? What binds us to places and spaces on the planet? It also made us wonder how members of our national community could be invisible, disempowered, and neglected. Did the discussion over semantics, (the label of “evacuee” versus “refugee”), reveal a deeper sensibility among Americans—that we may indeed contain populations that are not full citizens?

These two concepts, citizenship and community, are intellectually, socially, and organically linked to conflict. The interdependence of nations, contestations over identity, authenticity (ethnic or otherwise), global industrial exploitation or expansion, (depending on your point of view), and debates about which nations have the right to military power lead to inevitable conflicts. Are the origins of these conflicts, global, national, and communal, always what they seem on the surface?

This conference, held in California and a stone’s throw away from our most contested border, is the ideal place to engage in a dialogue about frameworks of citizenship and identity and analyses of conflict and resolution. I invite panels, papers, and roundtable discussions that expand and extend the scholarship on what it means to be a citizen, a member of a community, virtual, cultural, or physical.

Welcome to Las Vegas Entertainment and Dining Guide

While the Las Vegas experience contains a bewildering array of options, here are some general observations for visitors to the area.

Gaming:

Obviously, one of the main attractions of Las Vegas is the legalized gambling. I imagine that many of the participants at this year's WPSA annual meeting will want to conduct at least a few pilot studies in applied probability theory.

Although certain games of chance are ubiquitous in Las Vegas (for example, video poker in most grocery and convenience stores), there are three main areas of the city devoted to the gaming industry. Perhaps the least interesting of these is the Boulder Strip, named for its location on the Boulder Highway. Boulder Highway forms the eastern border of Las Vegas, and was the original route to Hoover Dam. This expedition requires an automobile, and the casinos share a depressingly uniform Wild West motif. For serious shopaholics, **Sam's Town** (Boulder Highway at Harmon) may be of interest, but there's not too much to the rest of the Boulder Strip that can't be found elsewhere.

Second, there is the Downtown area, which surrounds the Fremont Street Experience. This is about a \$10 cab ride from the Riviera, and represents the older section of Las Vegas. The Fremont Street Experience includes a dome, about seven city blocks long, covering Fremont Street from Las Vegas Blvd. to Main Street. The dome provides light shows at night, and air conditioning for the street during the summer. Gambling downtown is generally characterized by lower minimum bets than can be found on the Strip, and, in some cases, Downtown casinos offer more options for players than establishments on the Strip. For example, in blackjack Downtown tables offer such options as surrender, double down after split, etc. The area is a little less glamorous and less touristy than the Strip, but ideal for the low roller.

Finally, of course, there is the Fabulous Strip: Las Vegas Blvd., between Sahara on the north end, extending past Tropicana to the South. The Strip is about six miles long, and includes most of the famous hotels in the city. Newest, latest and greatest include the Wynn, the Alladin, Paris, and the Venetian. For serious garishness, it's hard to beat the Luxor (ancient Egyptian motif) and the venerable Bellagio (old Italy) and Caesar's Palace

(ancient Rome). Each hotel/casino has a specific geographical and historical motif. The low roller is best advised to confine one's Strip gambling to weekdays, and to daylight hours. On weekend evenings, it can be difficult to find a spot with reasonable minimum bets. On a Saturday night, for example, the minimum bet at most Strip blackjack tables is \$10, with some tables offering action for a \$100 minimum. Maximum bets can range up to \$20,000, which makes gambling a fascinating spectator sport.

Once you've decided where to go, the next question is what to play. While the odds on all games favor the House, there are meaningful differences between games with respect to the player's chances. Best bets for the player are Baccarat, blackjack, and craps. Even making very low bets, one can win or lose a great deal of money very quickly playing craps. Some of the larger hotels offer lessons in craps during weekday mornings.

Games such as Keno, Pai Gow Poker, or Roulette are strictly for the mathematically challenged (exception: one roulette table at the **Monte Carlo** casino on the Strip has only one zero, which makes the odds somewhat more reasonable). One game to avoid is Spanish 21. It looks for all the world like a version of blackjack designed to assist the player, but what you're not told is that all of the 10's have been cut out of the deck in advance. This *drastically* improves the odds for the House.

Video poker offers reasonable odds, and is relatively inexpensive (a hand of video poker typically costs 25 cents or \$1). Worst odds of all are the slot machines; while the low stakes of most slot machines are attractive (generally ranging from 5 cents to \$1 per pull of the lever, although one can find slots for as much as \$500 per spin), this is the most reliable source of income for the House.

Shows:

Among the major attractions of Las Vegas are the shows at the major casinos. These typically range from \$50 to \$150 per ticket. Check the guide in your room, or with the concierge for who's playing where.

Tickets2Nite is located in the famous giant bottle of Coke on the Las Vegas Strip. They are next to the MGM Grand Hotel and across the street from New York-New York. They sell tickets for many Las Vegas shows and attractions at 50 percent off the box office price. The availability of shows changes daily and continues to update throughout the day. You must come to the box office to obtain specific show information. Tickets

are sold on a first-come, first-served basis. So get there early for the best seats! They begin posting ticket availability at 11:30 am. Otherwise, one can just go to various hotel/casino websites to buy tickets directly.

Far From the Madding Crowd:

For those of you who are outdoor enthusiasts, why not visit our nearest state park: **Red Rock Canyon**. The park is just outside the city limits, but you will need an automobile to visit it. (For those of you planning to rent a car, watch the high car rental tax the state of Nevada charges tourists) Here you will see some spectacular rock formations and be able to enjoy the serenity of the Mojave Desert. The park has an informative visitors center. For those who simply want to view the scenery, take a drive around the 20 mile loop that runs through the park. On the way back, stop in one of our newest casinos, **Red Rock Station**.

To get to Red Rock Canyon, take any of the main North-South streets (Las Vegas Blvd, Maryland Parkway, Eastern Avenue) to Charleston Road. Turn right on Charleston, and drive about 30 miles, out of the city and to the park. Spectacular scenery, and watch for the wild burros.

As you marvel at the architecture of some of the resorts, just forty-five minutes from the strip is another great manmade structure, the **Hoover Dam**. A number of companies on the strip run both bus tours to and flights over the Dam. If you are going by car, take Boulder Highway South, or I-15 south (toward Los Angeles) and follow the signs.

For those willing to devote an entire day to nature, **Zion National Park** is about 3-4 hours away; take I-15 North across a corner of Arizona, and into Utah--worth at least one or two full days, and absolutely breathtaking.

DINING GUIDE

There are approximately 7000 restaurants in the Las Vegas Clark County area. The number of restaurants in Las Vegas has increased 20% within the last 5 years. This growth includes a number of new fine restaurants which are privately owned, as well as those that are operated inside casino hotels with celebrity chefs' names attached. The added fine dining has certainly raised the bar on the restaurant experience in Las Vegas, but the older hotel-owned properties and some out-of-hotel restaurants still hold to their

reputation of offering superb dining and service experiences. The core offerings of the larger hotels still include a coffee shop, a buffet, a steak house and a fine dining property. Listed in this restaurant guide is a snap shot of each type which has good recommendations and strong endorsements, (some by the WPSA committee members and local arrangement committee members) and are all worth experiencing.

Some of the restaurants in this guide are easy to get to and within walking distance. If you seek transportation to venture out from the Riviera vicinity, The Strip gives you many choices; you can hop on The Deuce doubled-decker buses or take a short taxi ride. The Deuce which provides service on The Strip, stops at most major resorts and continues north to downtown and the Fremont Street Experience. Single ride for The Deuce is \$2, or an all day pass is around \$5. While not on The Strip, the Las Vegas Monorail runs abaft of the casinos that set on the east side of The Strip from Tropicana Avenue to Sahara Road. A one-ride ticket is \$5; a one-day pass is \$15. Taxis are affordable with an average fare of \$10-\$12 dollars on or near The Strip (\$3.20 pickup fee and then is \$2.00 per mile).

Breakfast/Lunch Walking Distance

You can get a quick breakfast or lunch between scheduled panels and poster boards in restaurants conveniently located within the Riviera Hotel; **Kady's**, a 24-hour American café, on first level near check-in; the **World's Fare Buffet** which opens at 6:00am, located on second floor; and if you are in a super hurry there is **Kristofer's** offers an express continental breakfast from 6:00am to 11:00am., located on the first floor of the hotel's Monaco tower. A 24-hour **Jitter's Gourmet Coffees** shop has blends, latte, mocha, cappuccino and espresso is located near the check-in.

Directly across Las Vegas Blvd. is Circus Circus' **Barista Café** offering full breakfast starting at 6:30am, and lunch and dinner. There is also a **McDonald's** restaurant and a **Krispy Kreme Doughnuts** on the first floor.

Behind the Riviera is the Las Vegas Hilton, which houses the 24-hour **Fortuna Deli**, 3000 S. Paradise Rd., 734-5110. The deli offers an array of coffees and wines. You can walk directly out of the front door of the Riviera hotel and turn right to walk south along Riviera Blvd. for half block which will take you directly toward the Hilton.

Buffets - Breakfast/Lunch/Dinner

Most buffets will have a variety of themed cooking stations to choose from; which may include stations such as carving and rotisserie, American,

Chinese, Italian/ Pasta, Mexican/Fajita, Mediterranean, seafood station, large soups and salads and desserts bar. The three-meals-a-day, brunch breakdown times and pricing are comparably similar in range; breakfast 7am-11am, \$11.99; lunch 11am-2:30pm, \$12.99; dinner 4pm-10pm, \$16.99; Saturday and Sunday champagne brunch 8am-2:30 pm, \$16.99.

The **Hilton's The Buffet**, 3000 S. Paradise Rd., 732-5111, offers complimentary beer and wine with dinner; and Saturday and Sunday champagne brunch, with crab legs on Sundays. There are other popular buffets such as the **Rio Village Seafood Buffet**, 3700 W. Flamingo Rd. 252-7777, where visitors and locals can satisfy their crustacean appetites; other varieties of foods are offered as well. **Paris Las Vegas Le Village Buffet**, 3655 S. Las Vegas Blvd. 946-7000, offers Parisian cuisine, and cook to order stations such as a grilled beef medallion, lamb, chicken and sausage with vegetables station; cook to order crepes, sushi, and a generous crab legs station in addition to other types of food stations. **The Palm Fantasy Market Buffet**, 4321 W. Flamingo Rd., 942-7777 has an excellent Lebanese/ Mediterranean station, and further down the strip is the moderately priced **The Orleans French Market Buffet** 4500 W. Tropicana, 365-7111. Off the strip, at the **Green Valley Ranch Hotel's Feast Around the World Buffet**, 2300 Paseo Verde Pkwy., Henderson, 617-7777, patrons arrive in flocks daily for the cooked-to-order sautéed crab legs, and Mongolian grill stations served at dinner and Saturday/Sunday champagne brunch.

The **Wynn Las Vegas Buffet's**, 3131 S. Las Vegas Blvd., 770-7000, stellar tabled-clothed, real napkins and monogrammed silverware atmosphere and above-the-crest selection of foods will make you want to stay a while and taste slowly. You must try their tossed salad station, soups, king crab legs, and sushi. An excellent carving station includes rack of lamb. Make room for the pastry, crepes, and scooped gourmet sherbet and ice cream bar. Excellent champagne brunch on Saturdays and Sundays. The **Bellagio Buffet**, 3600 S. Las Vegas Blvd., 693-7111, is a recurring winner of the 'best of buffets' categories in local newspapers, and offers a similar buffet format as the Wynn buffet. The Wynn and Bellagio buffet and brunch prices are slightly above the standard but well worth it.

Prepare your palate for roast chicken cannelloni; Linguini al Frutti di Mare filled with shrimp, lobster meat, scallops, tomatoes; scallions in a seafood cream sauce; and Sausage Polenta consisting of sausage, peppers, onions, tomatoes and polenta.
