As you wait for the ferry, you can take a moment to watch the sea lions happily sunning themselves at Pier 39.

Shoppers will find their bliss at Union Square. Tourists will find their kitsch at Fisherman's Wharf and Ghirardelli Square. Animal lovers can look for buffalo in Golden Gate Park and the famous wild parrots of Telegraph Hill. Whatever it is you're looking for, you'll find it here.

We are pleased to welcome you to San Francisco. Enjoy the conference. But don't forget to step outside and discover (or remember) why so many people consider the City by the Bay the Best City in America.

THE THEME FOR THE 2011 MEETING TRANSNATIONAL BORDERS, EQUITY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

As escalating demographic change and deepening economic recession collide, transnational borders have been caught in a “perfect storm.” Political institutions and public policy initiatives continue to close the gates of transnational borders into the United States. The politics of racial and ethnic identity, immigration, and economic development revert to survival mode where “we” becomes “us versus them.” How can we recharge our economy, keep our political institutions and policy vital without making equity, diversity and social justice central to what democratic government does?

We invite panel proposals that incorporate the conference theme and encourage disciplinary and interdisciplinary approaches to the politics taking place along transnational borders. It is hoped that one of the

features of the conference will be dialogue between scholars working both within the discipline of political science and interdisciplinary fields of study on issues of equity and social justice along transnational borders.

This conference marks the first meeting by the WPSA in the state of Texas. The conference site opens possibilities for greater international collaboration and dialogue in scholarship on borderland issues.

In the Embarcadero Center, around the corner from the Hyatt, there are a number of good low- to mid-priced locations for a quick lunch. The Ferry Building (across Embarcadero) offers additional options, including higher end destinations and a series of shops at which one can put together a great impromptu picnic basket and enjoy the CA sunshine. Tuesdays and Saturdays at 9:30 am, Thursdays at 2:00 pm and Friday at 11:00 am. \$20 per person, kids age 9 and under are free. Tour is 2 ½ hours. (Tour starts 4 miles away; take Muni Bus N (\$2) from the Hyatt, departing from the Metro Embarcadero Center at Market and Main Sts.).

Wonderful petting zoo where you can feed and pet the llamas, goats, sheep and ducks. Smaller kids will love the insect zoo and the steam train. They have the usual fun zoo animals, but no elephants (you'll have to cross the Bay to the Oakland Zoo for elephants). Try to avoid the Zoo food. Other local choices:

- **Pier 39** Neighborhood: Fisherman's Wharf. A beautiful 1.4 mile walk up Embarcadero or take light rail line F from Market & Main St. Sea lions, street performers, kitsch and souvenirs; also a small aquarium and a carousel. Very touristy, but very fun. Several good restaurants but with tourist pricing.
 - **Crab House** (crabhouse39.com) 415/434.2722. Cracked crab with garlic butter and a bucket of Coronas. Great view of SF Bay as it's on the second floor. \$\$\$
 - **Chowders** (chowderspier39.com) 415/391.4737. Chowder in a sourdough loaf. Don't mess around with the other stuff on the menu. \$
- **The Exploratorium** (exploratorium.edu) 415/561.0356, 3601 Lyon St. Neighborhood: Marina/Cow Hollow. Kids of all ages and grown-ups who like to explore science like a kid will love this place; plan to spend a few hours playing with the exhibits, maybe dissecting a cow

eye. About 4 miles from the Hyatt; hard to park, so take a taxi or Bus #30 from Sutter St. & Kearny St. Avoid the food. Eat here instead:

- **The Chestnut Bakery** (chestnutbakery.com) 415/567.6777, 2359 Chestnut St. Wonderful pastries, also a killer curry chicken salad sandwich. Luckily, this neighborhood is close enough to walk across the Golden Gate Bridge afterwards and burn off all of the extra calories you're going to eat after you see the desserts. \$\$
- **Fisherman's Wharf** (fishermanswharf.org). Around North Point & Powell St. Touristy (but fun) shops, seafood and entertainment, including people-watching. A good place to take kids and teenagers. Walk down Jefferson St. and choose from among the seemingly endless string of street seafood vendors; it's hard to go wrong. \$ A nice 1.4 mile walk up Embarcadero (turn left (West) on North Point Street. Or take the F light rail from Market & Main to The Embarcadero & Bay St.
- **Ghirardelli Square** (ghirardellisq.com) 415/775.5500, 900 N Point St. Neighborhood: Fisherman's Wharf. Touristy chocolate and ice cream sundaes, other cute shops. A nice place to take the kids, or for a dessert and stroll after dinner in North Beach. Go with a group and get an earthquake (eight ice cream flavors, eight toppings, \$30).
