#### WELCOME!

On behalf of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, and the local arrangements committee, it is our pleasure to welcome you to Las Vegas. Las Vegas is an ideal setting for a conference whose theme is movement and motion. Each year, 40 million visitors pass through its busy streets, enjoying its ever-changing abundance of casino resorts, restaurants, and clubs. More significantly, the city itself is a study in motion, growing steadily, expanding its population, and widening its cultural offerings.

Early travelers knew Las Vegas as a watering hole along the Old Spanish Trail leading from New Mexico to California. A century ago, it was incorporated as a city with a population of approximately 2000. But with the legalization of gambling and the construction of the Hoover Dam in the 1930's, the region began to grow. Since 2000, the population has grown by 40% to its current level of approximately 2 million residents.

The city's skyline reflects the city's protean character: year after year, landmark casinos are imploded to make way for new, architecturally acclaimed resorts and high rises. Having weathered the last recession, the city is once again the site of ambitious building projects, including Caesar's Linq Promenade and High Roller (<u>https://www.caesars.com/linq/high-roller</u>). Visitors may wish to explore the new Downtown Project's popular Container Park, a shopping and dining venue near Fremont Street that offers a wide variety of free entertainment (<u>http://downtowncontainerpark.com</u>).

The city's most significant feature is its growing and increasingly diverse population. Las Vegas has been ethnically diverse from its inception, as its population included Southern Paiutes, African Americans, Chinese, Mexicans, and various Europeans. Many others have migrated here from the northern and eastern parts of the United States to take advantage of job opportunities or to retire to its sunny climate. More recently, the city has become a popular destination for immigrants from Latin America and the Pacific Rim. Benefiting from this trend, the University of Nevada, Las Vegas has one of the most diverse campuses in the United States.

Las Vegas has begun to mature culturally. The new art-deco inspired Smith Center for the Performing Arts hosts the Las Vegas Philharmonic and serves as an impressive venue for the fine arts. In addition, the city has designated an 18block 'Downtown Arts District' (<u>http://www.18b.org</u>) in order to nurture the local arts scene. Located to the north of the Strip, its boundaries are Las Vegas Boulevard, Hoover Avenue, Colorado Avenue, and Commerce Street. On the first Friday of each month, the district hosts a First Friday gallery walk featuring an eclectic group of visual and performance artists. The city also boasts numerous several unique, nationally-acclaimed museums, such as the National

Atomic Testing Museum and the Mob Museum. Several resorts maintain exhibits of artistic or historical interest.

Finally, no trip to southern Nevada is complete without a visit to nearby attractions such as the Hoover Dam, Lake Mead, and the stunningly beautiful Red Rock Canyon.

However you choose to spend your time while attending the conference, we hope that you are able to take advantage of our city's justly famous hospitality.

### **Theme:** The Politics of Peril and Opportunity

In 2016, we gather in San Diego, a city that crystallizes the politics of peril and opportunity. It is the principal home port of the Navy's Pacific fleet, but also home to more than half a million immigrants, including about 180,000 undocumented immigrants. Occasionally threatened by wildfires and earthquakes, San Diego also hosts nearly two dozen institutions of higher education, including public, private, and non-profit colleges and universities, all of which are grappling with drastic changes in higher education. This beautiful and interesting place offers a chance to reflect on the politics and opportunities involved in naming and addressing peril.

This theme directs our attention to contemporary crises and to the political construction of crisis. Perils dominate the headlines and provoke demands for political solutions: ISIS, Ebola and other infectious diseases, a "broken" immigration system, failures in public primary and secondary education, internationally rising economic inequality and falling unionization rates, police violence and corrupt politics, climate change, Russian aggression, and a host of other concerns. In every scholar's backyard as well loom concerns about changes in higher education in the United States and other countries, as faculty governance wanes, the use of contingent labor under exploitative conditions increases, and an economized bottom line increasingly becomes the yardstick for success in teaching and research.

#### CALL FOR PAPERS – 2016 ANNUAL MEETING

The intersection of crisis and politics provokes a host of questions we can ask and answer about how events become crises and what consequences this has. How does a framework of peril change how politics happens or reshape the contours of state power? How are things constructed as threats? Alternatively, under what circumstances do some terrible things continue to happen without ever being understood as perilous to individuals, institutions, or a polity? Related questions resonate in normative registers as well.

The flip side of the theme of peril is opportunity, and scholars of politics are well situated to advance understanding of how dangers create political and institutional opportunities. Proposals considering how political actors, ideologies, and institutions respond creatively to crisis are welcomed, especially where scholars can critically analyze the allocation and reconfiguration of power in response to peril. Expanding agendas and institutions to address homeland security, immigration control, military and quasi-military threats, lack of public funding for education, and other problems warrant a close critical eye. We should also consider whether these or other crises create currently unimagined opportunities to achieve more just societies and states.

In the longstanding tradition of the Western Political Science Association, scholars are encouraged to place problems at the center of their research and explore these problems vigorously through whatever range of approaches best illuminates them. And likewise, we expect that concerns about individual, political, and structural inequities across a host of dimensions will animate many of our conversations.

Please join us in sunny San Diego to devote a weekend to understanding how we do – and should – grapple with these and other perils and opportunities.

<u>Da Vinci The Exhibition</u> *The Strip, The Venetian* (3355 S. Las Vegas Blvd.) Leonardo da Vinci's timeless brilliance comes to life with Da Vinci

air shopping, dining and entertainment district called The LINQ. The High Roller can fit up to 40 people in each of its 28 enclosed and air-conditioned transparent pods. <u>Downtown Container Park</u> (700 East Freemont). The Downtown Container Park is a family-friendly outdoor shopping, dining, and entertainment attraction. Made completely of shipping containers stacked upon each other, this unique venue offers a variety of boutique shops and food outlets. There is a kids play area with 30 foot slide and water area in the middle of this urban destination located just blocks away from Fremont Street and Las Vegas Boulevard. <u>Freemont Street Experience</u> *Downtown* (425 Fremont Street). 702-678-5600. Located in Downtown Las Vegas, the Fremont Street Experience offers free nightly shows featuring 12.5 million lights and 550,000 watts of amazing sound at VivaVision. Enjoy free concerts and special events throughout the year. Times are 6pm, 7pm, 8pm, 9pm, 10pm, 11pm, 12am. Take a walk through the Neon Museum, which hosts some of the old hotel's neon signs, located at the east end of the Fremont Street Experience. vegasexperience.com

<u>Madame Tussauds Las Vegas</u> *The Strip* (The Venetian Resort Hotel Casino 3355 S. Las Vegas Blvd.) Madame Tussauds Interactive Wax Attraction at the Venetian features more than 100 wax replicas of celebrities from Liberace to Jennifer Lopez. The keyword here is interactive. This isn't a museum where the exhibits are displayed in glass cases or protected by velvet ropes Instead, the 30,000-square-foot attraction features two stories of figures and exhibits where you're encouraged to get up-close and take pictures with your favorite celebrities. Run your fingers through their hair, put your arm around their shoulders or given them a kiss on the cheek, it's all OK, and people do it. Another plus- you can bring in your own camera and spend as much time as you need finding the perfect vantage point and snapping a picture. *Family Friendly*.

<u>Shark Reef Aquarium</u> *The Strip* (3950 S. Las Vegas Blvd.) 702-632-4555. A trip to the Shark Reef at Mandalay Bay takes guests on a 14-exhibit journey through

a jungle environment into a sunken shipwreck where they will see 2,000 animals, including some of the most dangerous predators in the world. Accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium Association, the Shark Reef offers a pre-taped tour and has naturalists positioned throughout the exhibit to answer questions.

<u>Siegfried and Roy's Secret Garden and Dolphin Habitat</u> *The Strip* (3400 S. Las Vegas Blvd.) 702-791-7188. Opened in 1990, Siegfried and Roy's Secret Garden and Dolphin Habitat is the dream of legendary magicians Siegfried Fischbacher and Roy Horn, better known to millions as Siegfried & Roy. The Secret Garden and Dolphin Habitat at The Mirage Las Vegas showcases the duos dedication to animals with two areas - the Dolphin Habitat and the Secret Garden. Surrounded by palm trees, lush foliage and 2.5 million gallons of water, the Dolphin Habitat is a research facility designed to educate people about these amazing creatures. While the dolphins don't

perform, visitors can occasionally catch the animals engaging in natural play. Guests can also enjoy an underwater viewing area, shaded seating, a café and a gift shop filled with memorabilia including plush dolphin toys and even dolphin-shaped water guns.

The 8,000 square foot permanent exhibit hall includes artifacts on loan from personal collections, the Smithsonian Institution, Lawrence Livermore Laboratory and pieces of the Berlin wall and World Trade Centers. Designed to be a highly interactive experience, the exhibits include touch screens, motion-sensitive plasma TV presentations, audio interviews with former workers from the test site, and various other multi-media components. www.nationalatomictestingmuseum.org

<u>Nevada State Museum</u> *Off-Strip* (309 S. Valley View Blvd) 702-486-5205. ### DAY TRIPS

For those who have the time and are willing to do a little extra travelling, the following attractions are of particular interest and relatively close by for day-trip excursions:

Death Valley National Park (271 Highway 190, Death Valley, NV CA) 760-785-2392. Jagged, rugged, severe, beautiful, sublime- these are perfect descriptions of Death Valley National Park. "Surprising" is also a good word for the greater Death Valley area. There are desiccated and colorful desert vistas everywhere. Geological history is on full display. But there are also lush pockets of green plant life, Old West remnants and funky contemporary enclaves in this bigger-than-big wonderland.

### Tips:

- Always carry plenty of water and wear a hat, the elements here are intense.
- Fill up your gas tank before driving to Death Valley National Park. While gas is available at Furnace Creek Gas Station and Stovepipe Wells Gas Station, it is more expensive than outside the park.
- There is lodging available at Furnace Creek Inn, Furnace Creek Ranch and Stovepipe Wells. Food, sundries and groceries are available at these locations as well. Surrounding towns such as Tecopa, Shoshone and Beatty offer varying services.
- More than one million people visit the park each year. Spring and fall are the most popular and comfortable times to visit.

### Grand Canyon (www.nps.gov/GRCA/planyourvisit/index.htm)

Grand is an understatement. One glimpse of its majesty is all it takes to understand why the Grand Canyon is considered one of the natural wonders of the world. The canyon is a staggering 277 miles long. At its deepest, it is about a mile from the rim to the Colorado River far below and it is as much as 18 miles wide in some spots. The park encompasses 1,904 square miles and visibility on a good day can reach up to 100 miles. The beauty and vibrant colors of the rocks, the mighty river flowing through the center and the wide variety of plant and animal life that inhabit the canyon combine to make it a spot that 5 million people from around the world visit each year.

#### Hoover Dam (www.usbr.gov/lc/hooverdam/service/)

### Driving Directions To Hoover Dam from Las Vegas -- About 30 miles/45 minutes

- Take US Highway 93 South and continue about 20 miles to Boulder City
- In Boulder City, take a left at the second stoplight in town Continue on US 93 for about 5 miles (just past the Hacienda Hotel) to the turn-off to Nevada State Route 172 - the Hoover Dam Access Road
- Take NV SR 172 for about 2 miles to the Dam on the Nevada/Arizona border (Note: Visitors who wish to continue travel into Arizona must re-enter Nevada and access Highway 93 to cross the Hoover Dam Bypass Bridge; the roadway across Hoover Dam is no longer open to through-traffic.)

*Traffic Advisory:* Motorists can expect periodic delays on Highway 93, especially during holiday travel times. Also, all vehicles are required to undergo a security inspection prior to crossing the dam.

#### Lake Mead (601 National Highway, Boulder City, NV) 702-293-8907.

Thirty minutes away from the Las Vegas Strip is Lake Mead National Recreation Area, which occupies about 1.5 million acres (twice the size of Rhode Island) and 820 miles of shoreline. For only \$10, you'll have access to the lake for a week. It's a fun escape from the hustle and bustle of the Strip. Lake Mead is the 16th largest manmade lake in the world and one of the largest manmade lakes in the Western Hemisphere. Formed by the Hoover Dam along the Colorado River, the National Park Service established Lake Mead as a national recreation area in 1964. Lake Mead offers year-round recreation with everything from kayaking and jet skiing to swimming, hiking and wildlife viewing.
