WELCOME TO VANCOUVER!

On behalf of Simon Fraser University and the local arrangements committee, we would like to acknowledge the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh peoples on whose traditional territories we are privileged to live, work, and play.

We hope this year's conference offers an opportunity for you to develop new insights and understandings. As you meet new colleagues and catch up with old ones, be sure to take some time to enjoy all that Vancity has to offer. Consistently ranked as one of the top three most livable cities in the world with its unique blend of urban living and outdoor activities, Vancouver has something for everyone.

Although the First Nations people have called Vancouver their home for thousands of years, 1791 marked the first point of European contact with the arrival of the Spanish. The Spanish did not stay long in Vancouver, and the British eventually settled in the area for the fur-trade. Settlement really took off with the discovery of gold in 1858 and lumber mills sustained the small economy. Today, metro Vancouver boasts a population of nearly 2.5 million people, and we are among the most ethnically and linguistically diverse cities in the world. Indeed, more than 45 percent of our residents are foreign born, ranking us behind only Dubai, Brussels, and Toronto, while 52 percent of us speak a first language other than English.

As the city that gave birth to the *Greenpeace* movement, Vancouver now aspires to become the greenest city in the world. As you will see during your visit, it is well on its way! It has ample green spaces and community gardens, a dense network of bike lanes to get around the city, and you are sure to find a car2go around every corner. "Vancouverism" represents the city's vision to combine deep respect for nature while promoting a dynamic urban lifestyle. We have over 240 parks and beaches operated by the Vancouver Park Board. Stanley Park, located in the West Side, is known worldwide for its 400-hectare rainforest and seawall. The park is just a 30-minute walk from the conference hotel along the seawall, and encapsulates Vancouver's vision of urban living and respect for nature. In addition, the city has a growing arts and culture scene. Be sure to take a walk through Stanley Park, bike the Seawall, or watch a local play.

Vancouver is also a global city. To promote international relationships, Vancouver has partnered with five sister cities: Odessa, Yokohama, Edinburgh, Guangzhou, and Los Angeles. These partnerships focus on sharing information, educational exchange, and economic development. Currently, Vancouver is focusing on strengthening local businesses, as well as investing in high-growth sectors, such as digital media, clean technology, and renewable energy. The \$250 *Don T. Nakanishi Award for Distinguished Scholarship and Service in Asian Pacific American Politics*: This annual award will recognize outstanding scholarship or service advancing the understanding or practice of Asian Pacific American politics. The recipient will be someone who has made a significant contribution to the understanding of Asian Pacific American politics (scholarship that examines more than one ethnoracial group is also eligible), or whose professional work has made a substantial contribution to the practice of Asian Pacific American politics.

The \$250 *Betty Nesvold Women and Politics Award* for the best paper on women and politics presented at the 2017 WPSA meeting.

The \$250 *Award by Committee on the Status of Blacks* for an outstanding paper discussing issues and problems that concern most Black Americans.

The \$250 *Charles Redd Award for Best Paper on the Politics of the American West* for the best paper on the politics of the American West presented at the 2017 Annual Meeting. Papers may cover a broad range of topics—governance, policy, culture, politics—and may compare the West to other regions. The Charles Redd Center for Western Studies at Brigham Young University and the WPSA jointly offer this award.

The \$250 *Dissertation Award* for the best doctoral dissertation completed at a university within the regional groupings of the WPSA between July 1, 2016, and June 30, 2017.

The \$250 **WPSA Best Paper Award on Environmental Political Theory** for an outstanding paper on environmental political theory presented at the 2017 WPSA meeting.

The \$250 **WPSA Best Paper Award on Latino/Latina Politics** for an outstanding paper on Latino and/or Latina politics.

The \$500 *Pi Sigma Alpha Award* for the best paper presented at the 2017 WPSA meeting.

The \$1,000 *Political Research Quarterly Best Article Award* for the best article published in the *Political Research Quarterly* during 2017.

Theme: Contested Truth

Political scientists are faced with the task of teaching, learning, analyzing, and writing about politics in a new era of contested truth. While politics has always been conducted in the midst of arguments over facts, recent developments in information technology and political leadership in the United States and across the globe highlight the contemporary relevance of contested truth in advanced democracies as well as dictatorships and other authoritarian regimes.

From the invention of "alternative facts" to the invocation of unsubstantiated claims among other contested truths, I invite you to participate by presenting a scholarly paper or a work of pedagogical method. What are the analytical and conceptual contours of facts and truth in politics? How and why do political leaders, analysts, and commentators utilize alternative truths and to what ends? Why and how do students and citizens analyze the contestation of fact, and what strategies can they utilize to contribute to political truth?

You've arrived in Vancouver in the height of cherry blossom season and just before Punjabi New Year. What's next? The WPSA Annual Meeting local hosts have prepared this document to guide you through your time in this exciting city, including childcare options, activities, and dining. We see all sorts of weather in Vancouver, pack good shoes and an umbrella.

Vancouver Quick Facts

Vancouver is a big, busy, diverse, and global city. About 52 percent of Vancouver's residents have a first language other than English! The original settlements in this area were Coast Salish. Vancouver's quite warm compared to the rest of Canada—on average it'll be 10 degrees Celsius (50°F) in April—but often rainy. Vancouver is full of green spaces; the Hyatt Regency is within a 15minute drive of over 20 parks including famous Stanley Park.

Vancouver is divided into several geographic areas. Downtown, the neighborhood of the Hyatt Regency, is situated on the small Burrard Peninsula north of the larger mass of Vancouver City. North of downtown across the strait is North Vancouver, and west of North Vancouver is West Vancouver. South of downtown is the West Side. And west of downtown is West End. West Vancouver is north of West End, which is north of the West Side, west of East Vancouver. Got it? Don't worry, there's a map on the next page.

Neighbourhoods

Your trusty visitor's guide will make many references to Vancouver neighbourhoods to organize your possible activities. But where *are* those neighbourhoods? You'll find that it's also cooler closer to the water, so layer up.

Getting Around

Vancouver has the worst traffic in Canada, but there are plenty of other ways to get around. For starters, the city is incredibly walkable. Most of downtown is available to you on foot if you're able to walk 20 - 30 minutes. For instance, the following destinations are all within a 15 minute walk:

- Vancouver Art Gallery (7 minutes)
- Robson Street shopping (7 minutes)
- FlyOver Canada and Canada Place (12 minutes)

If you'd prefer not to walk or want to leave the downtown core, Tourism Vancouver has a great transit guide. In addition to buses, Vancouver has the SkyTrain, a driverless automatic rail. There's a transit station (Burrard Station) right outside the hotel. Just by waiting for the right bus or SkyTrain line at this station and getting off at the right spot, you'll be able to travel worry-free to places like:

- Science World (on the SkyTrain Expo line)
- BC Sports Hall of Fame (also on the Expo)
- Museum of Vancouver (on the #2 bus)

All these locations and more are listed in the detailed Activities section below.

ACTIVITIES

Vancouver will have plenty going on in April, including the Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival, which will be running up until April 17. Whether you're travelling with young children, teens, friends, or on your own, Vancouver has something to offer you. We've included performances running in Vancouver at this time as well as year-round attractions. If you don't see what you're looking for, Tourism Vancouver has a large directory of possibilities.

Entries with asterisks are especially kid-friendly, and entries in italics are open after 6PM.

Closes at 5PM. Tickets are \$24 for adults, \$18 for seniors and \$6.50 for children.

The week this ride was installed in Canada Place, a Vancouverite friend told us she had seen it three times. Closes at 9PM. Buy tickets online to get them for \$21 for adults. \$17 for seniors or teens, and \$14 for small children. (The actual ride lasts about 8 minutes.)

Museum of Vancouver

Open to 9PM on Friday and Saturday. Tickets are \$18 for adults, \$15 for seniors, \$8 for youth.

Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Classical Chinese Garden

Your admission includes a guided tour—the latest time is 3PM. The gift shop is a fantastic place to buy Vancouver souvenirs like jade earrings, chopsticks, and signature tea blends. The garden closes at 4:30PM. Tickets are \$12 for adults, \$10 for seniors, free for children 5 and under.

VanDusen Botanical Garden and Bloedel Conservatory*

5251 Oak St. and 4600 Cambie St. | 604-257-8584 | http://vandusengarden.org/ These two strongholds of nature are only 20 minutes apart on foot, so their owners encourage visitors to visit both. The VanDusen Garden is a 22-hectare space with a large number of different habitat arrangements, wildlife, and art and architecture installations, while the Bloedel Conservatory, which might be more exciting for children, contains tropical, subtropical and desert sections under which parrots and plants from around the world flourish. Tickets are \$8 for adults, \$5 for teens and \$4 for children with free admission for toddlers. tickets are \$6.5 for adults, \$4 for seniors and teens, \$3 for youth.

Stanley Park

Granville Island*

The island sits between downtown Vancouver and the rest of the city and houses a public market packed with local goods—from farmer's market classics like ceramics, jewelry and jams to fine foods like fresh-out-of-the-harbour fish and artisan sake, not to mention more elaborate products like the blacksmith's in

Railspur Alley and the boat shop. (Not mini gift boats. We're talking whole boats.) There's also a kid's market. Main attractions close at 7PM.

Special mention: Vaisakhi Parade*

If you stay in Vancouver for Sunday April 16, you'll get to be there on the day of the Punjabi New Year parade—which means beautiful floats and performances as well as plenty of delicious free Punjabi food. Everyone is welcome! Starts at 11am at the Ross Street Template (8000 Ross St.) and follows a parade route down Main Street.

EVENTS

Vancouver's theatre, dance and concert scene is impressive. Catching a play in a local theatre is a great way to complete your Vancouver experience, and they'll be open later than most daytime activities so you don't have to worry about rushing through that last conference session. A city as big as Vancouver has dozens of great events running at any given time, but here are some of the shows and celebrations running during April 13 – 15. Ticket prices and venues were correct as of February 1, but remember to double check—and if you're interested in the bigger shows, check soon to be sure you don't miss out on tickets.

Rodgers + Hammerstein's Cinderella | The touring Broadway adaptation of the Cinderella TV program that most recently starred Brandy Norwood in 1997. Suitable for all ages. At the Queen Elizabeth Theatre, 630 Hamilton St. Tickets between \$30 and \$110.

Angels in America, Part One: Millennium Approaches | A great opportunity to see the famous AIDS-crisis-era gay drama on the stage. At the Stanley Industrial Alliance Stage, 12th Ave and Granville Street. Tickets between \$29 and \$85.

Mom's the Word 3 | A third installment in a series of stand-alone plays centering the crazy, hilarious, ramshackle experiences of mothers just after their kids have grown. At the Granville Island Stage, 1585 Johnston St. Tickets between \$29 and \$49.

Room 2048 | Contemporary dance theatre incorporating selections from the oeuvre of Wong Kar Wai explores Cantonese diasporic desire, hopelessness and survival. At the Firehall Arts Centre, 280 E. Cordova St. Tickets \$33 for adults, \$28 for seniors and \$14 for children.

Redpatch | A locally authored play about a Nuu-chal-nulth youth who fights in the First World War. Ages 10+, possibly suitable for older children. At Studio 16, 1555 West 7th Ave. Tickets \$33, \$25 for seniors.

Generation Post Script | This science-fiction show might interest older teens with its contemplations, reminiscent of *The 100,* on the lives and anxieties of the

first generation of youth to be born in space after the destruction of the Earth. At Studio 1398, 1398 Cartwright St. Tickets \$28.

Vancouver Theatre Sports League | The games change from season to season, so it's hard to say at this point what kind of improv comedy you'll be able to watch here in April, but previous shows have rave reviews. At The Improv Centre, 1502 Duranleau St.—could be a great cap to an afternoon on Granville Island. Tickets \$8 - \$15 dollars depending on the day.

DINING

Vancouver is a foodie city packed full of dining adventures and comfortable favorites, and the Hyatt Regency is located in the middle of downtown, where attendees will have tons of choices just within walking distance. We've made some recommendations for great meals—not just downtown and in surrounding neighbourhoods, but further afield across the bridge in Kitsilano and Fairview if you're in the mood to explore. Google Maps or BC Transit's map tool www.translink.bc.ca can guide you around, and we've provided some of its recommended transit options below, but if it gets overwhelming, don't worry, because in downtown Vancouver there's an amazing restaurant every couple metres—just pick a direction and walk!

These selections are based on the suggestions of previous Western restaurant guide sages Lesley Burns and Rebecca Monnerat and Janni Aragon's dining experiences in Vancouver, as well as syntheses of reviews from tripadvisor.com and *Vancouver* magazine. We also tapped the expertise of Vancouverite colleagues to bring you a wide-ranging local perspective.

If you have kids with you, the selections with asterisks next to them will be especially friendly to them.

DOWNTOWN: GASTOWN/CHINA TOWN

Directions: A short cab ride or 15-20 minute walk north east from the hotel. Three minute SkyTrain trip from Burrard Station on the Expo Line toward Waterfront.







Convention Level (Third Floor)


