

Welcome to the WPSA's 2018 Annual Meeting. We are delighted to welcome you to San Francisco, home of Fisherman's Wharf, the Golden Gate Bridge, cable cars and colorful Victorian houses, and Alcatraz Island.

While in town for the meeting, you might set aside time to stroll through the flower show at Union Square, to take in an exhibition baseball game between the San Francisco Giants and the Oakland A's, visit the giraffes at the San Francisco Zoo, or the penguins at the California Academy of Sciences. Just across the street you can explore the Museum of the African Diaspora or recently renovated SF Museum of Modern Art. Visitors to Japantown can see the Peace Pagoda, and visitors to Chinatown can explore the Chinese American artifacts at the Chinese Historical Society. In the Mission District, grab a walking tour of the neighborhood's 75 colorful Latino-themed murals in a space of just six blocks. The oldest standing building in the city, an adobe chapel built in 1776 by order of Father Junipero Serra, sits at Dolores and 16th street. Nearby is the Castro, the world-famous gay neighborhood, where you can visit Harvey Milk Plaza and the GLBT History Museum, or head on over to the eastern end of Golden Gate Park to the National AIDS Memorial Grove. Ferry and boat rides can bring you to Angel Island, the Ellis Island of the west, to Alcatraz, or just out on the bay to look for sea lions and even whales.

We hope you have a wonderful visit to San Francisco. Enjoy the conference and your colleagues, new and old. But remember to take a break, go outside, and enjoy what many folks consider the most beautiful city in the United States. Just don't forget a sweater for the famous micro-climates that make this city unique at every turn!

ANTI-HARASSMENT POLICY

1.Purpose

The Western Political Science Association was created for the purposes of promoting the study and teaching of government and politics, to foster research, and to facilitate the discussion of public affairs. The Association promotes these purposes in the spirit of free inquiry and free expression. The primary event in which WPSA members gather is at the Association's annual conference. Harassment of colleagues, students, or other participants at the conference, or at any other WPSA-sponsored event or forum, undermines the principle of equity at the heart of the Association's principles and is inconsistent with the principles of free inquiry and free expression. Consequently, harassment is considered by the WPSA to be a serious form of professional misconduct.

The WPSA is committed to providing a safe and welcoming conference environment for all participants, regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, ability, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, age, or religion.

"Participant" in this policy refers to anyone present at or directly involved in WPSA meetings, including staff, contractors, vendors, exhibitors, venue staff, WPSA members, and all other attendees.

2. Expected Behavior

All participants at WPSA meetings are expected to abide by this Anti-Harassment Policy in all meeting venues including ancillary events and official and unofficial social gatherings.

- Abide by the norms of professional respect that are necessary to promote the conditions for free academic interchange;
- If you witness potential harm to a conference participant, be proactive in helping to mitigate or avoid that harm;
- Alert conference or security personnel if you see a situation in which someone might be in imminent physical danger.

3. Unacceptable Behavior

Unacceptable behaviors include:

- persistent and unwelcome solicitation of emotional or physical intimacy;
- persistent and unwelcome solicitation of emotional or physical intimacy accompanied by real or implied threat of professional harm;
- intimidating, harassing, abusive, derogatory, or demeaning speech or actions by any participant in an WPSA meeting and/or at any related event;
- prejudicial actions or comments related to race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ability, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, age, or religion that coerce others, foment broad hostility, or otherwise undermine professional equity or the principles of free academic exchange:
- deliberate intimidation, stalking or following;
- harassing photography or recording;
- sustained disruption of talks or other events;
- physical assault (including unwelcome touch or groping);
- real or implied threat of physical harm.

At the 2019 Annual Meeting, the Association anticipates the following ten awards:

The \$250 *Don T. Nakanishi Award for Distinguished Scholarship and Service in Asian Pacific American Politics*: This annual award will recognize outstanding scholarship or service advancing the understanding or practice of Asian Pacific American politics. The recipient will be someone who has made a significant contribution to the understanding of Asian Pacific American politics (scholarship that examines more than one ethnoracial group is also eligible), or whose professional work has made a substantial contribution to the practice of Asian Pacific American politics.

The \$250 **Betty Nesvold Women and Politics Award** for the best paper on women and politics presented at the 2018 WPSA meeting.

The \$250 **Award by Committee on the Status of Blacks** for an outstanding paper discussing issues and problems that concern most Black Americans.

The Clay Morgan Award for Best Book In Environmental Political Theory.

The \$250 Charles Redd Award for Best Paper on the Politics of the American West for the best paper on the politics of the American West presented at the 2018 Annual Meeting. Papers may cover a broad range of topics—governance, policy, culture, politics—and may compare the West to other regions. The Charles Redd Center for Western Studies at Brigham Young University and the WPSA jointly offer this award.

The \$250 *Dissertation Award* for the best doctoral dissertation completed at a university within the regional groupings of the WPSA between July 1, 2017, and June 30, 2018.

The \$250 WPSA Best Paper Award on Environmental Political Theory for an outstanding paper on environmental political theory presented at the 2018 WPSA meeting.

The \$250 WPSA Best Paper Award on Latino/Latina Politics for an outstanding paper on Latino and/or Latina politics.

The \$500 *Pi Sigma Alpha Award* for the best paper presented at the 2018 WPSA meeting.

The \$1,000 *Political Research Quarterly Best Article Award* for the best article published in the *Political Research Quarterly* during 2018.

Theme: The Politics of Climate Change

Meeting in Paris in 2015, nations committed themselves to keep the rise of the world's temperature well below 2 degrees Celsius (compared to pre-industrial levels), and to strive to limit the increase to only 1.5 degrees. Most climate experts agree that if we fail to meet this target, we risk catastrophic costs to humanity and nonhuman life. A middle-of-the-road view holds that to meet this target, we must peak greenhouse gas emissions in the next few years, and reduce net emissions to zero or close to zero rapidly thereafter (no more than a few decades).

The necessary reductions will require significant global cooperation, and further action is needed to adapt to impacts of anthropogenic climate change that are already underway. However, international and domestic efforts over the past quarter century have come nowhere near what is required on either front.

Meeting this challenge requires concerted action in multiple domains, including international relations, domestic politics, the economy, law, technology, education, and the cultural sphere. Though political scientists (including WPSA participants) have made important contributions to our understanding of the problem, the attention devoted by the field as a whole remains inadequate, and

the subject often receives limited coverage in undergraduate and graduate curricula.

The problem engages all subfields of our discipline. We need the insights of those who study national and local politics, international cooperation, domestic and international law, policy processes, public opinion, science and politics, politics and technology, environmental justice, social movements, corporate responsibility, migration and refugees, political ideology, global justice, and moral theory, among other topics.

We invite proposals that enhance our understanding of the politics of climate change – why the world has not risen to the challenge and what needs to be done. Discussions of any aspect of the subject are welcome. We encourage both scholarly works and discussions of curricular and pedagogical strategy.

Please note: All participants in the program are required to preregister for the 2019 WPSA meeting by December 31, 2018.

TRANSPORTATION

Getting Around San Francisco

Muni

Muni is San Francisco's bus and metro system that runs throughout the city, operating buses, trains, cable cars and the F-line heritage streetcar. Muni buses remain above ground and on streets while Muni Metro runs on rails and sometimes go underground. Bus stops come in many forms: small bus shelters, yellow paint on street poles, and white paint on streets. Metro stops can be found on an island in the middle of the street and in underground stations. Using the Metro Map, find the nearest Metro to your location. Find more information on how to use Muni and Muni Metro.

For all Muni routes and times, you can call 511. There are also many smartphone apps, including the 511 SF Bay Transit Trip Planner app, that provides maps, routes and times.

Cable Cars and Street Cars

Cable cars and street cars are San Francisco's historic public transit cars. Cable cars are located downtown and run on three lines: Powell-Hyde, Powell-Mason, and California Street. The F-Line streetcar runs up and down Market Street all the way to Fisherman's Wharf. Pay the conductor onboard or purchase tickets in advance at multiple locations or via smartphone using the MuniMobile app. Exact change is your only option when you are onboard the vehicles.

Ride Sharing

There are a few on-demand car services to choose from, most of them started by San Francisco locals. To use them, you must first download the app, register, and set up a credit card payment system. Uber and Lyft both offer options to request a private car service as well as shared car options for a discounted rate, such as Lyft Line and uberPOOL. To use these services, set a pick-up location and destination in the app. Within minutes, you will be matched with a driver. Make sure to communicate with your driver; call, text, or wave down their car and always confirm that you are getting in the correct vehicle. Get more ride sharing tips.

Taxi

As is customary in most U.S. cities, visitors may hail a taxi directly or use a smartphone app.

San Francisco Visitor Passport & CityPASS

If you are staying for more than one day, Visitor Passports and CityPASS are useful because they provide unlimited rides on Muni, Muni Metro, historic streetcars and cable cars. There are multiple locations throughout the city where you may purchase tickets and day passes, including the San Francisco Travel Visitor Information Center, where the VIC staff and volunteers curate the San Francisco experience, providing one-on-one interaction with visitors from around the world. Find the VIC at the Powell and Market cable car turnaround at 900 Market St.

Clipper Card

The Clipper Card is an easy way to use the various modes of public transportation throughout San Francisco. Purchasing this pre-loaded card gives you access to BART, Muni buses, Muni Metro, and cable cars. When you board, hold the card over a scanner and listen for the beep to make sure that you have an adequate balance on your card for your fare. Be warned: fines are steep and Muni personnel check frequently for fare evasion. Cards can be bought at multiple locations and refilled at Muni/BART stations.

MuniMobile

The new MUNI bus app that lets you see routes and pay your fare.

Transportation Costs

For reference, here are typical prices for various transportation options around the city as of July 2017

- BART from SFO to SF downtown: round-trip \$17.90, one way \$8.95.
- BART from OAK to SF downtown: round-trip \$20.40, one way \$10.20.

- Single Ride Muni Bus/Train: \$2.75 (\$2.50 with a Clipper Card or the Muni Mobile App).
- Single Ride Cable Car Ticket: \$7.
- Ride sharing (like Uber and Lyft) is typically under \$15 for most trips around the city.
- Taxis are typically under \$20 for most trips around the city.

IN MEMORIAM

Our WPSA colleague Ted Jelen has passed away.

Long time WPSA member Ted Jelen died this past fall after a lengthy illness. Ted had been an active participant in WPSA meetings for many years, serving twice as Chair of Local Arrangements for meetings that were held in Las Vegas. He was a frequent paper author and panel participant at both WPSA and APSA meetings. The APSA has created the Professor Ted G. Jelen Award for the best article on religion and politics in Ted's honor.

Ted joined the faculty at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas in 1997 as chair and full professor and has been credited with raising the profile of that department. Earlier he had taught at Benedictine University, Ipek University in Turkey, Georgetown University, and DePauw University. Current UNLV Political Science Department chair, John Tuman, described Ted as being "a driving force in the recognition of the growing importance and influence of religion in American politics." Ted's work included 16 books (as author, co-author, or editor) and 150 journal articles and book chapters. He also co-founded and co-edited the journal Politics and Religion.

Ted was 65. His lively spirit will be missed at WPSA meetings!


FROM INCLUSION TO INFLUENCE

Latino Representation in Congress and Latino Political Incorporation in America

Walter Clark Wilson is Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Texas at San Antonio.

In From Inclusion to Influence, Walter Wilson addresses urgent questions regarding the political incorporation of Latinos in America. First, he demonstrates that Latino representatives in the U.S. Congress do, in fact, represent Latino interests more effectively than do other representatives, both by serving as conduits connecting fellow Latinos to the government and by introducing their concerns into the legislative process. Then, moving beyond the debate about descriptive and substantive representation, Wilson identifies the ways in which the efforts of Latinos in Congress enable the meaningful inclusion of Latinos in politics, foster the ability of Latinos to shape public policy, and ultimately promote democracy in an increasingly diverse nation.
