1.Purpose

The Western Political Science Association was created for the purposes of promoting the study and teaching of government and politics, to foster research, and to facilitate the discussion of public affairs. The Association promotes these purposes in the spirit of free inquiry and free expression. The primary event in which WPSA members gather is at the Association's annual conference. Harassment of colleagues, students, or other participants at the conference, or at any other WPSA-sponsored event or forum, undermines the principle of equity at the heart of the Association's principles and is inconsistent with the principles of free inquiry and free expression. Consequently, harassment is considered by the WPSA to be a serious form of professional misconduct.

The WPSA is committed to providing a safe and welcoming conference environment for all participants, regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, ability, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, age, or religion.

"Participant" in this policy refers to anyone present at or directly involved in WPSA meetings, including staff, contractors, vendors, exhibitors, venue staff, WPSA members, and all other attendees.

2. Expected Behavior

All participants at WPSA meetings are expected to abide by this Anti-Harassment Policy in all meeting venues including ancillary events and official and unofficial social gatherings.

- Abide by the norms of professional respect that are necessary to promote the conditions for free academic interchange;
- If you witness potential harm to a conference participant, be proactive in helping to mitigate or avoid that harm;
- Alert conference or security personnel if you see a situation in which someone might be in imminent physical danger.

3. Unacceptable Behavior

Unacceptable behaviors include:

- · persistent and unwelcome solicitation of emotional or physical intimacy;
- persistent and unwelcome solicitation of emotional or physical intimacy accompanied by real or implied threat of professional harm;
- intimidating, harassing, abusive, derogatory, or demeaning speech or actions by any participant in an WPSA meeting and/or at any related event;
- prejudicial actions or comments related to race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ability, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, age, or religion that coerce others, foment broad hostility, or otherwise undermine professional equity or the principles of free academic exchange;
- deliberate intimidation, stalking or following;
- harassing photography or recording;
- sustained disruption of talks or other events;
- physical assault (including unwelcome touch or groping);
- real or implied threat of physical harm.

At the 2023 Annual Meeting, the Association anticipates the following ten awards:

Don T. Nakanishi Award for Distinguished Scholarship and Service in Asian Pacific American Politics: This annual award will recognize outstanding scholarship or service advancing the understanding or practice of Asian Pacific American politics. The recipient will be someone who has made a significant contribution to the understanding of Asian Pacific American politics (scholarship that examines more than one ethnoracial group is also eligible), or whose professional work has made a substantial contribution to the practice of Asian Pacific American politics.

The \$250 **Asian Pacific Americans and Politics Best Paper Award** for the best paper on Asian Pacific Americans presented at the 2022 WPSA meeting.

The \$250 *Betty Nesvold Women and Politics Award* for the best paper on women and politics presented at the 2022 WPSA meeting.

The \$250 *Award by Committee on the Status of Blacks* for an outstanding paper discussing issues and problems that concern most Black Americans.

The Clay Morgan Award for Best Book In Environmental Political Theory.

The \$250 *Charles Redd Award for Best Paper on the Politics of the American West* for the best paper on the politics of the American West presented at the 2022 Annual Meeting. Papers may cover a broad range of topics—governance, policy, culture, politics—and may compare the West to other regions. The Charles Redd Center for Western Studies at Brigham Young University and the WPSA jointly offer this award.

The \$250 *Dissertation Award* for the best doctoral dissertation completed at a university within the regional groupings of the WPSA between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022.

The \$250 *WPSA Best Paper Award on Environmental Political Theory* for an outstanding paper on environmental political theory presented at the 2022 WPSA meeting.

The \$250 *WPSA Best Paper Award on Latino/Latina Politics* for an outstanding paper on Latino and/or Latina politics.

The \$500 *Pi Sigma Alpha Award* for the best paper presented at the 2022 WPSA meeting.

Returning to the city by the bay, San Francisco in the state of California, the 2023 conference location will once again provide the opportunity for WPSA to reconvene after the 75th Anniversary celebration held in Portland, Oregon in 2022. midst of disunity? What does unity mean for WPSA and its members? Under what circumstances can we realistically achieve unity in the midst of disunity?

We invite proposals that discuss the many ways we can think of unity in the midst of disunity from the points of view of our very diverse range of sections to help realize a renewed understanding and appreciation of the democratic pluralism that undergirds our society. We encourage members to submit proposals that explore how feasible and achievable unity is in the midst of such polarized division and in what ways division and disunity have affected and will affect the endurance of the American experiment in constitutional self-governance.





WPSA GUIDE TO PORTLAND

Exploring Portland

Portland is a city of neighborhoods and districts, each full of fun things to do and see, and unique places to eat and drink. The conference will be held in Downtown Portland, in the city's southwest quadrant. While there are more than enough restaurants, bars, green spaces, museums, concert halls, shopping options (sales tax free in Oregon!), and food carts downtown, the city has a great deal more to explore!

GETTING AROUND

Within downtown, Portland is a very walkable city. However, if you're looking to venture further afield, or are hoping to explore one of Portland's other fascinating districts or neighborhoods, Uber/Lyft or public transportation are your best bets for getting around.

LOCAL TRANSIT: Public Transportation:

TriMet operates Portland buses, MAX light rails, and streetcars. TriMet fares work across all service types, and there are several convenient options for purchasing a ticket.

OPTION #1 – Pay with your phone: Use a card in your mobile wallet (Apple Pay, Google Pay, or Samsung Pay) to pay your fare. Tap every time you board a bus/train (including when you transfer). Your mobile wallet should keep track of your rides, and you'll never pay more than the cost of a day pass (\$5) for a single day's rides

OPTION #2 – Hop Tickets: You can buy a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -hour ticket (\$2.50) or 1-day pass (\$5) from a ticket machine at a MAX station using cash, change or a credit/debit card. Tickets work for both TriMet buses and Trains, and expire $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours after purchase (you can transfer between services with the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour gap for no extra charge). 1-day passes expire at 3 a.m.

OPTION #3 – Purchase a Hop Card: Buy (for \$3) and load/reload a Hop card from supermarkets, pharmacies, or convenience stores. Tap every time you board a bus/train (including when you transfer). The card keeps track of your rides, and you'll never pay more than the cost of a day pass (\$5) for a single day's rides.

Family-Friendly Activity Guide

Portland has a wealth of family-oriented activities within easy reach of the Hilton Hotel by foot, car, or public transportation. OUTDOORS

Portland is dotted with city parks of various sizes, but it's really our two biggest public parks that provide great hikes and a complete outdoor experience right in the heart of the urban center.

WASHINGTON PARK: Washington Park is the crown jewel of the Portland city park system. This 410-acre park has plenty of places to walk and lounge as well as numerous main attractions that are compelling destinations in themselves:

FOREST PARK: Forest Park is massive 5,200-acre park that covers much of the northwestern section of the city. With more than 80 miles of trails, this park is a great destination for hikers who want to experience Oregon's natural beauty without having to travel far outside the city.

WATERFRONT PARK: This downtown riverfront park offers a 1.5 mile stretch of green along the Willamette River. OMSI (Oregon Museum of Science and Industry)

Portland's massive and popular science museum—located across the bridge, just over a mile from the Hilton—is packed with hundreds of interactive exhibits and displays, a planetarium, and even a submarine tour. **Address:** 1945 SE Water Ave, Portland, OR

Powell's City of Books

Covering an entire city block, this Portland landmark is the world's largest new and used bookstore. Portland Art Museum

The renowned Portland Art Museum is the oldest museum in the Pacific Northwest. Located in the heart of downtown's Cultural District—just 0.2 miles away from the Hilton—the museum's campus includes an outdoor sculpture court, permanent galleries, and special exhibitions. **Address:** 1219 SW Park Ave, Portland, OR

Oregon Historical Society

Located in downtown Portland's South Park Blocks—0.2 miles away from the Hilton—the Oregon Historical Society's museum features original and traveling exhibitions telling stories of the people, places, and events that have shaped Oregon and American history. **Address:** 1200 SW Park Ave, Portland OR

Lan Su Chinese Garden

Lan Su Chinese Garden resulted from a collaboration between the cities of Portland and Suzhou, our sister city in China's Jiangsu province that's famous for its beautiful Ming Dynasty gardens. Lan Su was built by Chinese artisans from Suzhou and is one the most authentic Chinese gardens outside of China. Address: 239 NW Everett St., Portland, OR

Art Exhibition: APEX: Sharita Towne & A Black Art Ecology of Portland

This art exhibition provides a glimpse into Towne's burgeoning project "A Black Art Ecology of Portland" (BAEP), an initiative she launched in 2019 to bring together community organizations in support of creating, reclaiming, and redefining spaces for Black art and audiences in Portland. BAEP remaps historical and contemporary Black creative life in Portland and beyond. Activities have included developing co-creative spaces for art, murals, public art activation, video, COVID relief, residencies, DIY publishing, a comedy show, memorials for Black life, and more. Addressing the transdisciplinary nature of her work, Towne states, "With BAEP I think of the city as *form*. And *Ecology* is used to counter the mid-century logic of blight—that Black people are a detriment to urban ecology. BAEP acknowledges the active, creative vitality of Black communities from the past, present, and into the future of Portland."
