WELCOME MESSAGE

Welcome to Seattle region. There is much to occupy your attention at the conference during your time here, but we hope that your visit also affords opportunity to experience the city and its surroundings, on *lands which touch the shared waters of all tribes and bands within the Suquamish, Tulalip and Muckleshoot nations, a place where many indigenous peoples thrive, alive and strong.*

Seattle has long been known as a location of political radicalism, experimentation, and innovative cross-racial Civil Rights organizing, and it remains an exemplary (or notorious) "Left Coast "City. Yet it is also located in a state with a regressive tax structure that rivals Mississippi's; starving our schools and sometimes shocking visitors who encounter thoroughfare streets and freeways that barely qualify as being "paved". Seattle is notorious as a White City, yet it has also has a vibrant Black community that nurtured crossover music superstars Ray Charles, Jimi Hendrix, and Quincy Jones. The city's position as a Pacific Rim trade center has made it a home to Asian-American icons like Carlos Bulosan, Bruce Lee, and John Okada. Washington State also been a crucial location for Chicano and Farmworker activism. Our complexity and contradiction defies reputation and eludes easy summary. It's not even true that we get an excess of rain. While some locals will concede that we are prone to mist during certain parts of the year, Seattle gets less annual precipitation than New York, Boston, Miami, Chicago, Washington, or Dallas. (This is a point of pride, and the reason using an umbrella in a downpour is a surer indicator that you are from out of town than saying "Pike's" Place Market.)

The region's economic history is also complex. Long a backwater company town, where a 1971 Boeing downturn led to a prominent billboard asking "the last person to leave Seattle" to "turn out the lights", the region became the world's first high-tech boomtown metropolis with the explosive growth of Microsoft, Amazon, and other behemoths in the 90s and 00s. For a while, Seattle absorbed growth while maintaining the edgy, arty, weirdness that fueled the 1990s Grunge and Riot Girl movements, cultural touchstones that briefly made Seattle an international center of everything "cool". Eventually, population growth between 2000-2015 led to more generic redevelopment in the central parts of town, sanding off the edges and making at least the central city less distinctive. Many cheap Downtown loft spaces around Pioneer Square were lost, shrinking a once thriving artist community. One indicator of change is that more than half the longstanding establishments in a 2009 guide to Seattle's Best Dive

Bars have now disappeared, replaced by more extravagant ferned or concepted cocktail emporia. Yet this growth and change has been managed in ways that add additional contradictions. Persistent NIMBYism has made it challenging to meet growing housing demand, yet the broader region has also supported transformative expansion in mass-transit infrastructure and a strong regional growth plan that has protected many natural areas, mitigating the destructive suburban sprawl that blight other parts of the West and Southwest.

Short term visitors won't have any more luck making sense of all this than long time residents. But we do hope that your visit affords some opportunity to peel back the onion and experience the seductive allure of the city and region.

Please also mark your schedules for a special address by APSA president <u>Taeku Lee, who will be speaking at noon on Thursday, April 17, in the Willapa ballroom on the fifth floor.</u> As leader of the American Political Science Association, Lee's unique perspectives on the current state of the discipline, and the profound challenges faced by all of the social sciences in the U.S., will surely constitute one of our conference's most significant and insightful presentations.

ANTI-HARASSMENT POLICY

The Western Political Science Association was created for the purposes of promoting the study and teaching of government and politics, to foster research, and to facilitate the discussion of public affairs. The Association promotes these purposes in the spirit of free inquiry and free expression. The primary event in which WPSA members gather is at the Association's annual conference. Harassment of colleagues, students, or other participants at the conference, or at any other WPSA-sponsored event or forum, undermines the principle of equity at the heart of the Association's principles and is inconsistent with the principles of free inquiry and free expression. Consequently, harassment is considered by the WPSA to be a serious form of professional misconduct. The WPSA is committed to providing a safe and welcoming conference environment for all participants, regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, ability, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, age, or religion.

"Participant" in this policy refers to anyone present at or directly involved in WPSA meetings, including staff, contractors, vendors, exhibitors, venue staff, WPSA members, and all other attendees.

All participants at WPSA meetings are expected to abide by this Anti-Harassment Policy in all meeting venues including ancillary events and official and unofficial social gatherings.

- Abide by the norms of professional respect that are necessary to promote the conditions for free academic interchange;
- If you witness potential harm to a conference participant, be proactive in helping to mitigate or avoid that harm;
- Alert conference or security personnel if you see a situation in which someone might be in imminent physical danger.

Unacceptable Behavior

Persistent and unwelcome solicitation of emotional or physical intimacy;

Persistent and unwelcome solicitation of emotional or physical intimacy accompanied by real or implied threat of professional harm; Intimidating, harassing, abusive, derogatory, or demeaning speech or actions by any participant in an WPSA meeting and/or at any related event;

Prejudicial actions or comments related to race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ability, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, age, or religion that coerce others, foment broad hostility, or otherwise undermine professional equity or the principles of free academic exchange;

Deliberate intimidation, stalking or following; Harassing photography or recording;

Sustained disruption of talks or other events;

Physical assault (including unwelcome touch or groping);

Real or implied threat of physical harm.

ANNUAL AWARDS AND AWARD SUBMISSION DEADLINES

At the 2025 Annual Meeting, the Association anticipates the following fourteen awards provided through the WPSA, the *Political Research Quarterly*, and the *Politics Groups and Identities* journals:

The Asian Pacific Americans and Politics Best Paper Award: for the best paper on Asian Pacific Americans presented at the 2025 WPSA meeting. (\$250 award)

The Betty Moulds Lifetime Service Award: This award was created to honor the contribution made by Betty Moulds to the WPSA. Moulds had an extraordinary impact on the association during her 25 years as its chief administrator. The Association would not enjoy the success that it has today without the efforts she made during all her years of service. The award is given to an individual who has made a long history of service and an extraordinary contribution to the WPSA.

The Betty Nesvold Women and Politics Award: For the best paper on women and politics presented at the previous Annual Meeting of the WPSA. (\$250 award)

Blacks and Politics Award: This award, given out by the Committee on the Status of Blacks in the Profession, is for an outstanding paper discussing issues and problems that concern most Black Americans. (\$250 award)

Charles Redd Award for Best Paper on the Politics of the American West: an award offered jointly by the WPSA and the Charles Redd Center for Western Studies of Brigham Young University for the best paper on the politics of the American West presented at the previous Convention of the WPSA. Papers may cover a broad range of topics--governance, policy, culture, politics--and may compare the West to other regions. (\$250 award)

Clay Morgan Award for Best Book in Environmental Political Theory: The purpose of this award is to recognize outstanding scholarship, published in a book-length monograph, which utilizes the resources, literatures, and approaches of the field of political theory to address intersections between contemporary or historical environmental challenges on the one hand and the philosophical and ideological concepts, principles, and debates animating political life on the other. While the focus of the award is on political theory, we welcome books that make a contribution to the field from related disciplines – including, but not limited to, anthropology, environmental

humanities, ethnic studies, geography, indigenous studies, philosophy, political economy, science and technology studies, or sociology.

Dissertation Award: For the best doctoral dissertation completed at a university within the regional groupings of the WPSA between July 1 and June 30 of the previous academic year. (\$250 award)

Don T. Nakanishi Award for Distinguished Scholarship and Service in Asian Pacific American Politics: This annual award will recognize outstanding scholarship and service advancing the understanding or practice of Asian Pacific American politics. The recipient will be someone who has made a significant contribution to the understanding of Asian Pacific American politics (scholarship that examines more than one ethnoracial group is also eligible), and whose professional work has made a substantial contribution to the practice of Asian Pacific American politics.

Environmental Political Theory Best Paper Award: for the best paper in environmental political theory presented at the annual WPSA meeting. (\$250 award).

Latina/Latino Politics Best Paper Award: For an outstanding paper on Latina/Latino politics and its relative aspects. (\$250 award)

The Politics, Groups, and Identities Best Article Award: This award is given for the best article published by the PGI during the prior calendar year. (\$500 award)

The Political Research Quarterly Best Article Award: This award is given for the best article published by the PRQ during the prior calendar year. (\$1000 award)

William E. Connolly Award: This annual award is for the best political theory paper in contemporary democratic thought, whether recognizing daring and innovative work by a young scholar or a bold new line of inquiry by an established scholar. It is named after William E. Connolly, world renowned political theorist, revered teacher and mentor, and long-time WPSA member.

WPSA Best Paper Award: For the best paper presented at the previous WPSA annual meeting. (\$500 award)

HOW TO SUBMIT

Committee Chairs, Section Chairs, and other participants are encouraged to nominate papers for award consideration. The following guidelines are to be noted by persons submitting work:

- 1. With the exception of the PRQ Award, no previously published material is to be submitted.
- 2. Review processes for each award are conducted by award committees consisting of at least three political scientists. The review process is anonymous.
- 3. WPSA awards carry monetary prizes determined by the Executive Council, or, in the case of the PRQ award, determined by the PRQ Editors.
- 4. Papers must be submitted through the web-based submission system within six months of receipt of the award.

LOCAL GUIDE

We try in our local guide to give a local perspective on ways to make the most of a short and presumably busy conference visit.

HOW TO GET AROUND

Sound Transit's **LINK LIGHT RAIL** is the best way of getting downtown from the airport. Despite the construction at SEA-TAC finding the light rail station is easy – just go to the floor one above baggage claim and follow the walkway to the LINK station. The fare is \$3 for adults, and tickets can be purchased at the station. The hotel is located a brief walk from the Westlake Station. If you need or prefer auto transit from the airport, regular taxis are generally a better bet than the very crowded Uber lot.

Once at the conference, the Link train can be taken to various locations north and south of downtown. As we detail below, there are often clusters of good restaurants and bars around LINK stations.

King County Metro buses also offer easy transit from the Hyatt Regency to other areas. Key routes include:

- The D and E Lines to Fremont and Ballard
- The new G line to Capitol Hill, Madison Valley, Madison Park.
- The 2 and 3 routes to First Hill, Central District, Seattle U., and Madrona

If you are going to use transit a bit it is worth getting an Orca card to avoid having to use cash for each trip. Google Maps works very well for Seattle transit, providing detailed, up-to-the-minute transit directions.

There are countless dockless <u>e-bikes and especially e-scooters</u> lying around for short term rental by APP that are very popular for medium length trips. In town, Uber and Lyft are also widely available but expensive.

SOME THINGS TO DO

Seattle's top attractions include the Museum of Flight, the Space Needle, the Chihuly Museum, Seattle Art Museum, Pike Place Market, and the Museum of Pop Culture. All are worthwhile. There are also our mountains, including proximity to three National Parks. Unfortunately, April is still too early in the Spring to be able to access most of the state's most spectacular hiking. The in-city options we highlight here are interesting things that might otherwise fly below radar. Our biggest recommendation is to spend at least some time outside of downtown, experiencing some of Seattle's more distinctive neighborhoods. Mass transit busses and light rail are well integrated with Google Maps to find directions and real time departures.

The Burke Museum. On the UW campus close to University District Light Rail Station. Excellent museum moved to its dramatic new location a few years ago, with updated exhibits on the natural history of the Northwest, highlighted by collections related to the indigenous peoples that were carefully curated in collaboration with members of regional tribal communities. You can also take the fascinating and educational Indigenous Walking Tour around campus designed by UW Political Science undergraduate Owen Oliver.

The Museum of History and Industry. An interesting regional history museum that has always been curated with a tilt toward worker and social movement struggles in the region. Worth visiting now for an excellent exhibit commemorating the 25th Anniversary of the WTO protests.

Northwest African American Museum. The Seattle region's rich African American history is celebrated through rotating exhibits covering arts, politics, and culture It is adjacent to a park memorializing Jimi Hendrix.

Wing Luke Museum. Fascinating, well-curated, International District Museum celebrates the art and culture of the region's Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander communities. There is also a **Pinball Museum** nearby.

Pike Place Market. This is obviously not below anyone's radar but still worthy of a plug. Yes, it is crowded, touristy, confusing; but it is also still a real working market where locals still visit and shop. It is worth wandering a bit beyond the most touristy places (the Gum Wall, an "Original Starbucks" that is not the original Starbucks) to visit the underground corridors with weird old specialty shops and a coin operated shoe museum.

URBAN PARKS. Easily accessible options, for strolling and people watching include: **Myrtle Edwards Park**, on the Elliott Bay Waterfront, which can be combined with a visit to the excellent and free **Olympic Sculpture Garden**. On Capitol Hill, **Cal Anderson Park** near the light rail has a small but perpetual pop-up flea market, and has been the staging ground for much protest activity. The larger **Volunteer Park**, where you can huff to the top of a giant 1906 Water Tower for views and an interesting exhibit on the Olmstead Brothers' design of the city's parks system (no elevator). The park also has the excellent Seattle Asian Art Museum. It is adjacent to Seattle's most visited tourist attraction, the gravesite of Bruce Lee and Brandon Lee in **Lake View Cemetery**. **Washington Park Arboretum** has very pretty walking trails and an excellent **Japanese Garden**. For paddling, you can rent a Kayak at the **Agua Verde Paddle Club** near UW or the **Center for Wooden Boats** (and a few other places) on the southern end of Lake Union.

Our list highlights some of our favorite spots that might otherwise elude conference goers in town for a short time. We have organized it by neighborhood, in rough order of distance from the Hyatt.

Be aware that prices tilt high. Around downtown and Capitol Hill, a "low-priced" restaurant (or even a food truck) will almost certainly run \$20 per person including service, and middle range places start upward from \$30. If you are on a very limited budget, there are more cheap eats options in the U-District or International District. For vegans and vegetarians: Almost every sit-down restaurant will have at least one suitable dish. Finer restaurants often have multiple appealing options even if they are not dedicated vegetarian places.

Walking Distance from Hotel

Seattle's neighborhood orientation means that the downtown hotel district is not one of the better places in town for dining. It is the one neighborhood that locals (including the authors of this guide) don't go to eat. There are many hotel restaurants that are fine but not spectacular or good value. There are also outposts of many national chains around downtown. We have just a few specific suggestions for downtown.

Dough Zone, 815 Pine St. is our local chain for Xia Long Bao (Chinese Soup Dumplings). Some claim it is equal to the more famous **Din Tai Fung**, part of a restaurant empire based in Taipei that has an outpost in Pacific Place near the hotel. Both are very good but usually crowded so get on the waitlist.

La Caviste, 1919 Seventh Avenue. Excellent wine bar/café that focuses on French wines by the glass. The kitchen is small, but what they have (salads, small plates, and especially the chacuterie and cheese boards) is all excellent.

Pho Bac and **Phocific Standard Time.** The street level restaurant has quality Pho and Bahn Mi and the upstairs bar has inventive cocktails, many utitilizing Vietnamese flavorings. Part of an award winning restaurant group run by sisters Yenvy and Quynh Pham.

Purple. 1225 4th Avenue. A big, bustling wine bar/café that features mostly small plates and a large selection of wines by the glass, tilting toward Pacific Northwest wineries. Good place for a small or medium sized group to meet for a drink and snack.

Quick Lunch Near Hotel

There are clusters of lunch places and food trucks in the area behind the **Amazon Spheres** (known to the locals as "Jeff's Balls") toward Denny Street and up into the South Lake Union neighborhood. Some are smaller outposts of some popular Seattle restaurants and local chains (e.g., Skillet Counter at the Regrade, Momiji South Lake Union, Marination).

Pacific Place is a big downtown shopping mall that is now mostly empty on its lower floors after most of the retail stores have moved out. The dystopian Zombie movie vibe of the first impression is relieved some with a normal set of mall restaurants on the fourth floor. The Nordstrom Café in the adjacent flagship store also has mid-scale sit down lunch options and a pleasant enough vibe.

Seattle Convention Center has a collection of quick turnaround restaurants for conventioneers. https://seattleconventioncenter.com/visitors/retail

Asean Food Hall. 400 Pine Street. In the basement of Westlake Center. Food court featuring various stalls with street food from East and Southeast Asia. The concept and variety make this an OK option. Westlake Center also has **Xian Noodles**, with excellent Shaanxi province hand shaved noodle dishes.

<u>Pike Place Market and Vicinity-</u> a bit further but still walkable.

Café Campagne. 1600 Post Alley. Adjacent to Pike Place Market, this is Seattle's eternal French Bistro, with good renditions of all the classics for dinner as well as weekend breakfast. Also one of Seattle's longest-standing Black owner/chef restaurants. **Ludi's Restaurant.** 120 Stewart Street. A Seattle institution, this perpetual Filipino American diner has bounced around different incarnations in this vicinity since the 1970s and seems to be thriving in its new location. Open only for breakfast and lunch. It has standard diner food but go for the Filipino and Filipino American dishes (locomoco, several types of silog). The dayglo Ube pancakes, available only on weekends, are legendary.

Matt's in the Market on the third floor of the Corner Market building has good upscale Northwest cuisine.

Lunch or Snacks in Pike Place Market: find using Google Maps

Market Grill's cramped counter has been around a long time and has good sandwiches with (mostly) locally sourced seafood, usually from \$15-\$25 each.

Athenian Seafood has been around forever with OK diner food and views of Puget Sound, as does the nearby and bigger **Lowell's.** Athenian was once famous as a location for in *Sleepless in Seattle*.

Oriental Mart has a James Beard award winning lunch counter hiding behind a small Asian Grocery in the Corner Market building. Very good down-and-dirty Filipino food. **Mee Sum Pastries.** A busy walkup window that has excellent Hombow for a quick and satisfying lunch.

DeLaurenti Food and Wine. This upscale Italian grocery store has a bustling café counter with high quality panini. Not much room to sit down but good grab-and-go on a nice day.

DOWNTOWN BARS. Most hotels have bars and there are others all around that are, for the most part, what they appear to be from the outside. Two outstanding downtown cocktail bars can be found down between the market and waterfront, **Jarrbar** (with a tinned fish menu) and the **Zig Zag Café**, a foundational bar for the Seattle cocktail scene. **Deep Dive**, underneath the Amazon Spheres, is a swanky cocktail bar inside a giant art installation, helmed by Seattle's top restauranteur. Reserve ahead. Much less fancy is **The Diller Room** (next to Seattle Art Museum), a hotel bar that feels older than it is, in a good way. Going west from downtown up 1st or 2nd Avenue takes you into Belltown, an area with a wide array of bars and restaurants catering to recent college grads and young professionals from Seattle and the near suburbs. Going in the opposite direction gets you into the Pioneer Square area, with Seattle's oldest buildings and more bars and restaurants, many geared to the nearby stadiums.

<u>First Hill/Capitol Hill-</u> Most places a healthy uphill walk or short bus/train/uber ride from downtown.

The large Capitol Hill neighborhood includes a broad range of demographics, including some clusters of dense housing as well as sections with hundreds of multi-million-dollar mansions. There is a bustling, youthful, nightlife area in the Pike/Pine corridor between 14th Avenue and Melrose St; another cluster of restaurants and bars on Broadway around the Light Rail station and Cal Anderson Park. A few favorites.

Stateside. 300 E. Pike Street. Excellent elevated Vietnamese-ish food and cocktails. **Café Suliman.** 1531 Melrose Ave. Inside Melrose Market. Hidden inside an eclectic wine bar, Chef Ahmed Suliman turns out small plates of delicious North African food from a tiny kitchen nook. Only a few tables and best for smaller groups.

Mamnoon. 1508 Melrose Ave. A good upmarket Middle Eastern restaurant in a large space that can accommodate groups.

Taylor Shellfish. 1521 Melrose Avenue. (Also has branches near Seattle Center and in Pioneer Square.) A top Washington oyster and mussel farming company operates this café and retail space, offering fresh shellfish from Puget Sound waters. A good place to sample Washington's oysters. Short but excellent wine list with good pairings.

Single Shot. 611 Summit Avenue E. Exemplary upscale neighborhood bar/restaurant has Northwest-ish small plates and matching cocktails and wines by the glass.

Kedai Makan. 1449 E. Pine. Inventive and good value Malaysian food and craft cocktails.

Kubota Ookami Katsu and Sake House. 121 15th Avenue E. Very Japanese feeling place for Katsu (breaded fried pork loin) dishes.

Gold Coast Ghal Kitchen. 1009 Boren Avenue. A newish place has excellent West African food and an interesting cocktail menu.

Capitol Hill Bars. There are too many to count, ranging from true dives to fancy upscale cocktail and wine bars. Drinking places of note include **The Doctor's Office** (precisely prepared cocktails in chic space), **Knee High Stocking Company**, (a secret and eccentric speakeasy, call ahead), **Comet Tavern** (old school dive with good beer taps and sometimes bands), **Wildrose** (a community institution, affectionately known as "Seattle's only lesbian bar"), and **La Dive** (quirky combination of oddball wines by the class, champagne bongs, and surprisingly good dumplings). If you are in a group that wants to sing, **Rock Box** has a warren of private Karaoke rooms of various sizes along with drinks and Japanese bar snacks.

CENTRAL DISTRICT AND AROUND.

East of Downtown, across Capitol Hill, this was Seattle's African American neighborhood before gentrification changed it over the last two decades. The historic corner of 23rd and Union now house two of Seattle' hottest new Black owned restaurants.

Communion and **Marjorie** are both are lively spaces with good bar scenes and a very friendly vibe. **Marjorie**, tucked into a courtyard space in one of the new developments, is especially worth seeking out. The neighborhood also has several excellent Ethiopian restaurants. **Ras Dashen** is our favorite.

Near Seattle University, **L'Oursin** is a top restaurant choice for creative Northwest/French cuisine. A well designed and stylish space with a big open kitchen, relaxed vibe, and outstanding bar and wine program. Highly recommended. They also have an adjoining café for light lunch.

The Central District also houses a classic Seattle hipster dive (**The Twilight Exit**, with surprisingly good bar food) and two Black-owned breweries (**Metier Brewing** and **23rd Street Brewing**) as well as **Standard Brewing**, which also has a full bar and more food choices. **Chuck's Hop Shop** is a fun neighborhood beer emporium with 50+ mostly Northwest taps and a different food truck every night.

INTERNATIONAL DISTRICT.

This neighborhood includes a mostly Chinese section as well as a small historic Japan Town (5th and 6th Avenues uphill from Jackson toward Yesler) and a sprawling Little Saigon (centered at 12th and Jackson). Highlights include **Mike's Noodles** (unchanged for decades, excellent for Hong Kong style noodle soups), **Maneki** (Seattle's oldest restaurant, with excellent Japanese food), **Diamond Bay** (a new dim sum parlor that gets rave reviews), **E-Jae Pak Mor** (hip and dayglo place for Thai), **Shanghai Garden** (for barley green noodles), **Huong Binh** (excellent eclectic strip mall Vietnamese) and **The Boat** (Vietnamese fried chicken rice). **Tamarind Tree** has excellent elevated Vietnamese cuisine in a pleasant space that can usually accommodate groups. The historic **Panama Tea House** has a memorial that includes some preserved items left by Japanese Americans who never returned to Seattle after being sent to internment

camps during WWII. **Fort St. George** is a bustling local favorite with a youthful crowd in a cramped upstairs bar/restaurant. It has Japanese style bar food, including authentic renditions of the genre of "American food" popular in Japan.

UNIVERSITY DISTRICT. Less than 10 minutes on the light rail to University District Station. Twice as long by car.

Like most university neighborhoods, the U District has some good places mixed in with many other cheap restaurants that are best avoided. Standouts include **Xian Noodles** (so good that a few copycat places with similar names have tried opening nearby), **Thai Tom**, (arguably still the best of what seems like fifty small Thai restaurants in the neighborhood), **Mister Bing** (for excellent jianbing), **Korean Tofu House**, and **Chili's South Indian. Off-the-Rez Café** at the Burke Museum has excellent Native American fast food. The best food in the neighborhood is at **Little Duck**, away from main drag and hidden next to an ancient dry cleaner on an islanded strip mall. Every city needs its small, unsigned, yet impossibly good Chinese restaurant with a peculiar regional specialty (Dongbei province, in this case) of unusual dishes not seen elsewhere in town. **Little Duck** has just a few tables, but they are snaggable because they mainly do a thriving delivery business. Outstanding value for some of the most interesting and delicious food in town.

U-District Bars Strong enforcement of the drinking age in the neighborhood, combined with the fact that graduate students can't afford to live so close to the city center, means that there are fewer bars than you might expect. **Big Time Brewery** is a high-quality brewpub. The basement **College Inn Pub** is much bigger than it seems when you walk in, with good beer selection, some pool tables, and good chili. **Schultzy's** has excellent homemade sausage platters and sandwiches as well as a well-curated, mostly local tap list. Further west of campus, the **Blue Moon Pub** is a protected Historic Landmark/dive bar that has a long history of hosting various misfits, artists, and literary figures (Kerouac wrote about it, Thomas Pynchon supposedly spent a lot of time there incognito, etc.). Live bands most evenings.

BEYOND THE UNIVERSITY DISTRICT- There are interesting clusters of fine restaurants in neighborhoods spreading out to the north and west, including **Fremont** and **Greenwood.** Most notable is probably **Ballard** (medium trek from downtown by bus or Uber). A visit here can combine an afternoon trip to the **Nordic Heritage Museum** with an evening out. The neighborhood has a concentration of small-scale live music venues, excellent restaurants, breweries, and bars clustered around Ballard Way and Market St. The many waterfront shipping supply and boat repair businesses retain the feel of old Seattle. Two destination places are by Renee Erickson: **Walrus and**

Carpenter and **Barnacle Bar**. **Pestle Rock** has excellent Isan Thai Food and **Rupee** has upscale South Indian/Sri Lankan food. Many other options.

If the weather is good, it is fun to get out on the water by taking the **Seattle Water Taxi** from its downtown waterfront pier over to West Seattle. The ferry lands next to **Marination Makai**, a popular waterfront Hawaiian restaurant with great patio seating and beer selection. The beach, bars, and restaurants of the Alki neighborhood are a mile and half walk along a waterfront trail, or quick bus ride, away.

DINING OPTIONS EASILY ACCESSIBLE BY LINK LIGHT RAIL

Beacon Hill Link Station

Chef Melissa Miranda's nationally renowned yet unpretentious **Musang** offers perhaps the best Filipino cuisine in Seattle, offering a wide variety of vegetable dishes made with an innovative vegan substitute for savory Filipino shrimp paste, as well as hearty but complex-flavored fare like 24-hour braised short ribs and fried chicken and gravy. Make sure to get a side of the garlic rice. **Bar Del Corso** serves what some consider to be the best Neapolitan-style pizza in Seattle with an authentic oven, thin-crusted with high-quality toppings. Also on offer are classic Italian appetizers like arancini, grilled octopus, and burtata and broccoli rabe, as well as salads made with fresh local ingredients. **Oak** is an upbeat, family-friendly pub a quick walk from the Link station. It has a good selection of local beers on tap, and a very good gastro pub menu featuring an outstanding chicken sandwich and a wide assortment of creative salads. **Perihelion Brewery** has a wide selection of excellent beers, not only signature West Coast-style IPAs but English, Belgian, and German styles, and has a small but surprisingly good bar menu.

Columbia City Link Station

Chef/owner Meredith Molli's **La Medusa** specializes in flavorful Sicilian cuisine, featuring fresh pasta and local ingredients (including many grown on her own farm.) The seasonal chalkboard menu changes daily and always features multiple vegetarian options. A well-curated list of mostly Southern Italian wines is available. You can also enjoy an aperitif and snack as well as a very well-curated selection of Italian ingredients and wines to take back as gifts (or to your room) at the adjoining Italian market **Persephone**. **Island Soul** is a lively restaurant featuring classic Jamaican dishes like jerk chicken, vatapa, fried catfish, and tostones. It also has excellent happy hour specials and both traditional and innovative Caribbean cocktails. **Billiard Hoang** offers unpretentious but excellent Vietnamese cuisine in the unlikely setting its name suggests. **Delish** has authentic Ethiopian cuisine with an extensive vegetarian as well as meat-based selections, and most importantly the wonderfully spongy Teff Injera flatbread. **Sam Choy's Poke to the Max** brings classic poke preparations in a casual setting. The star is indeed the fresh, ice-cold raw ahi tuna or salmon in a variety of preparations (with "Sam's spicy"

particularly recommended) and presentations (including salads, rice bowls, and tacos.) The Korean-style garlic fried chicken and kalua pork are also excellent. Traditional Hawaiian side dishes like mac and cheese salad, seaweed salad, and haupia are also available. **Flying Lion** is a very good local brewery, especially for connoisseurs of English ales.

Othello Link Station

Bang Bang Kitchen specializes in the cuisine of New Mexico, and is owned by two sisters from the Land of Enchantment who bring in authentic red and green Hatch chiles to make signature sauces (try the "Christmas" that mixes both) to accompany good enchiladas and burritos. Also a great place for a happy hour snack – try the green chile hush puppies and good selection of tequila and Mezcal-based cocktails. **Huong Duong** is a reasonably priced Vietnamese restaurant with particularly good phở. **Taco Street** has authentic Mexican street food very well-prepared with a salsa bar.

FINE DINING/SPLURGE WORTHY PLACES

If you have money to spend or something to celebrate, top high-end places include: **LtD Edition Sushi.** 1641 Nagle Place. Capitol Hill. Among Seattle's several outstanding fine-dining destination sushi restaurants, this one stands out for its outstanding sake program.

Bateau. Renee Erickson's upscale beef emporium has Northwest grass-fed beef butchered and aged in the French style. Expensive but the place to go if you like beef. If you'd like to try Erickson's famously good oysters at a lower price point (and in a more comfortable setting than her Ballard outpost), try the adjoining **Boat Bar**.

Altura. 617 Broadway E. Outstanding place takes an Italian approach to Northwest ingredients for its set menu dinners. Great space and service combine with some of the best food in town.

Sushi Suzuki. 4116 ½ **E. Madison Street.** Tucked down a side alley in Madison Park neighborhood, this is another omakase Japanese restaurant with a charismatic chef. **Archipelago.** 5607 Rainier Avenue S. Down in Rainier Valley, this acclaimed restaurant has a very creative set menu of Northwest ingredients and Filipino flavors, rooted in chefs Amber Manugui and Aaron Verzoza's keen appreciation of how Seattle's history is tied to empire and colonialism.

COFFEE IN SEATTLE.

Seattle deserves its reputation for having an excellent coffee culture. Every neighborhood has at least one independent café that serves as a neighborhood hub and daytime hangout. The baseline quality of beverage is high. In the past, there was a fairly set style for small local roasteries, as well as a clear hierarchy. More recently, things have fractured in a bunch of different creative directions, including trends toward

regional specialties (particularly Africa and Vietnam) and some novel brewing techniques. The only remaining point of universal agreement among cognoscenti is a shared sense of embarrassment that Seattle is the birthplace of the execrable Starbucks. Downtown used to be a coffee wasteland, with chains but no presence for Seattle's excellent local roasters. Now many local roasteries worth trying have outposts near the hotel, e.g., Herkimer, Olympia, Anchorhead, Victrola, Fulcrum, and Caffé Ladro. The longstanding old school champion of Seattle independent roasters is Espresso Vivace, with locations near the Capitol Hill light rail and the REI flagship store.

Earthquake Aftershocks: The Politics of Transforming the Seattle Waterfront The 1999 Seattle earthquake kicked off a decades-long transformation of west downtown, including the tear-down of a major elevated freeway, construction of a costly new tunnel underneath the city, a rebuilt seawall, development of waterfront properties, the creation of transit, bicycle, and pedestrian boulevards, and – in 2024 – an astonishing new pedestrian park extending from Pike Place Market to Elliot Bay. Cary Moon is an urban design and landscape architect and former candidate for Seattle mayor. She cofounded and led the People's Waterfront Coalition, which advocated for taking the

billions of dollars scheduled for Seattle's "big dig" tunnel to create an array of green transit, pedestrian, and public spaces on the waterfront. While the tunnel option was eventually chosen, some of the ideas advocated by the People's Waterfront Coalition were also adopted. On this walk, Cary will discuss the backstory of the transformation, which has helped define Seattle politics in the early 21st century. A scheduled meeting point will be available for those unable to complete the walk; contingency plan in case of inclement weather.
